Each year on Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the church. If the mission and ministry of Jesus is to continue, it is upon us, his disciples to

What is Love Lunches?

During the school year, some students receive free/reduced hot lunch provided by the school districts/state. This service may not be provided during the summer months, causing financial strain and added stress on families. During the summer months, Hope partners with three other churches in this ministry. Love Lunches serves the children and families of Ankeny, lowa by providing a meal and opportunity to build relationships with others in the community. Love Lunches provides a varying menu consisting of hot meals, deli sandwiches, and grill-out days. Students and their families are able to enjoy a meal and build community with one another. Love Lunches serves every day except for July 4, and serves between 50-190 meals everyday!

On Site Love Lunch Servers: Lunches are served behind Ankeny Presbyterian Church at 317 SE Trilein Drive. Volunteers are needed from 11:00 am-1:00 pm to help prepare and serve the lunches. Please sign up all children 10 or older as an individual volunteer.

Love Lunch Site Coordinators: This is a great opportunity for those wanting to volunteer at least once a week. Our goal is to have two site coordinators serving each day who take on more of a leadership role sharing the following tasks:

- Show up a few minutes before the other volunteers (10:45) to read through the menu and ensure all supplies are available.
- · As other volunteers arrive, assign serving roles and tasks
- · During serving time, keep the the serving line stocked with food
- During the serving time, welcome and mingle with the community
- Supervise clean up.
- Reference the next day's menu and check supplies. Communicate with the site coordinating team if there is anything needed.
- Most days your serving time concludes by 12:45-1:00.
- Occasionally pick up groceries at Fareway or supplies from Sam's Club
